
A reminder our school office will be open form Friday 31st January with students returning on Thursday 6th February. Our annual swimming carnival will take place on Friday 14th February.




# **OPSIE Star Students**




Wes is recognised for his consistent respect and responsibility in all areas. He's always ready to assist both teachers and classmates and gives his very best effort in every learning task.


